Re: Natural Gas Commodity Rates Impact to Customer Statements

Dear Customer:

While continuing to pursue financial relief measures and investigations into price gouging for February 2021 natural gas prices, at the Board of Public Works (BPW) meeting held on March 15, 2021 it was approved to begin recovering the \$2,151,680.51 natural gas expense incurred in the event that relief is not provided. A typical bill for the month is estimated to have calculated \$313,709.80. The retail rate for natural gas was not increased for March 1, 2021 utility statements to account for this drastic commodity increase. Also, the effects of the frigid temperatures mid-February 2021 increased Macon Municipal Utilities' electricity commodity costs as well. However, the BPW is utilizing reserves to pay for this extra expense of nearly \$1 million and not passing it along to customers.

Beginning with April 1, 2021 statements, an extra charge for natural gas will be added to your utility bill. While the plan will be reviewed monthly and approved by the BPW annually, it is anticipated to require 36 months to replenish natural gas reserves. Winter and summer adders were approved in an attempt to provide a much steadier addition for customers to not excessively burden any one time of year. The rate will be displayed on your monthly statement as "*Gas (ccf) 2021 Adder*". Please see below:

For customers enrolled in the Budget Billing program, when setting your payment beginning with May 1, 2021 statements, MMU will take the extra steps to include this natural gas recovery cost. Letters will be sent by early April letting you know this newly calculated amount.
